

Cookie Policy

Introduction

This is the Cookie Policy of Child Paths Limited ('Child Paths') of DCU Invent, Dublin City University, Glasnevin, Dublin 9.

Child Paths is committed to compliance with the General Data Protection Regulation and the Data Protection Act 2018, with specific regard to fair processing of personal data and transparency in our data processing policies and procedure. As such, this Cookie Policy is to be read in conjunction with our Privacy Policy that explains all our data processing procedures, etc.

The purpose of this Cookie Policy is so that individuals understand how we use cookies in relating to the use of our website via a user's computer, tablet, smart phone or any other device that may access our website, and or the use of cookies on via our mobile applications ('apps').

Upon initial access of our website or app, you will be notified of the use of cookies, this Cookie Policy along with our Privacy Policy. You will be asked to confirm that you wish to accept the use of cookies and our policies in order to use this website or app by way of an interactive 'pop up' that requires affirmative action on the part of a user. By accepting the use of cookies, a website user is accepting the terms of this cookie policy and agreeing to abide by them.

What is a cookie?

A 'cookie' is a small piece of data that a website asks your browser to store on your computer, tablet, smart phone or any other device that may access our website. The Child Paths app may use cookies in order to provide some services.

If you allow the use of a cookie, this allows the website to 'remember' your actions or preferences over time. Most browsers support cookies but users can set their browsers to decline them. Users can delete cookies whenever they like through their own browser or device (discussed below).

How cookies are used by the Child Paths

We may use the following cookies on our website www.childpaths.ie and app:

Session cookies are temporary cookies that are not stored on your computer or mobile device. They are used as part of the registration process for security purposes. A session cookie is also used to remember your language preference when viewing the site. These session cookies are erased when you close your browser, or after 20-30 minutes of inactivity.

Persistent cookies are those placed on your computer or mobile device for a pre-determined length of time when you visit this site. This site only places cookies that are specific to this site.

Our website may use Google Analytics in order to assist us with ongoing maintain review, assessment and redevelopment of our website. The most common Google Analytics Cookies are:

Cookie Name	Expiration Time	Description
_ga	12 months from last visit	Used to distinguish visitors to site
_gat	10 minutes	Used to throttle request rate
_utmt	10 minutes	Used to throttle request rate
__utma	12 months from last visit	Used to distinguish visitors and pages visited. Records a unique ID, the date and time of first visit, time of current visit and total number of visits made
__utmb	30 minutes from last visit	Used to determine new sessions or visits. Stores the number of page views in current visit and start time of visit
__utmc	Session cookie	Used to note that the visit has ended when browser is closed
__utmz	6 months	Records the site you may have linked to our page from. Only records data if you clicked on a link to our site from a different website

Strictly necessary cookies. These are cookies that are required for the operation of our website. They include, for example, cookies that enable you to log into secure areas of our website or make use of payment services, without which we would not be able to provide you with services or secured areas.

Analytical/performance cookies. They are set by the Child Paths and third parties, including Google Analytics. Performance cookies allow us to collect statistical information about our visitors, such as whether they have visited the site before and the pages they view. This information is gathered anonymously and does not contain any personal data as this information does not enable us to identify who you are.

We may use these cookies to determine the kind of content and service our visitors value the most, which in turn helps us improve our website and its content.

We and third-party vendors, including Google, use first-party cookies and third-party cookies together to inform, optimise and serve ads based on users' past visits to this website. We use data from Google Analytics to understand who our users are in order to create a better experience for them while visiting our website. We may use Remarketing with Google Analytics to advertise online. Third-party vendors, including Google, show our ads on sites across the Internet. Functionality cookies. If you allow these cookies they are used to recognise you when you return to our website. This enables to personalise our content for you as a website user but we are not able to identify you as an identifiable person without you volunteering personal data.

Data that may be logged

As stated above, some technical details in connection with visits to this website may be logged by our internet service provider for statistical purposes. Such technical details are confined to the following list:

- The IP address of a visitor's web server
- The top-level domain name used (e.g. .com, .org, etc.)
- The previous website address from which the visitor reached us, including any search terms used.
- Google analytics that show the traffic of visitors around this website (e.g. pages accessed or documents downloaded).
- The type of web browser and operating system used by the visitor to the website.

We may use the above technical data and or cookies to:

- Recognise when a website user moves between pages of our website. This can be used to speed up access to the website as visitors may not have to log every time they use the website (if applicable).
- To ensure the safety and integrity of the website, app or any online channel of communication.
- Carry out research and statistical analysis to help improve website content and to help us better understand visitor requirements and interests.
- Target our marketing and advertising campaigns by more effectively by providing interest-based content on the website.
- Make the website user's online experience more efficient and enjoyable.

Should a website user choose to provide us with any user specific identifiable personal data during the use of the website (e.g. signing up to an account or logging in, placing an online order, making an enquiry and providing contact details for us to respond, etc.) then we treat such information as personal data in accordance with our Privacy Policy.

We do not collect any names or emails unless a website user volunteers to provide such personal data for the purposes of contacting us.
